

Progress on Meeting Program Goals – January 2020 Update

GOAL 1: Recruit highly qualified applicants to include those underrepresented in health care and U.S. military veterans.

Outcome measures: Academic and demographic profile of the matriculated cohort

Benchmark: 1) Matriculated cohort will exceed national average in PA program enrollment of underrepresented minorities, and 2) Matriculated student cumulative UG GPA, Cumulative UG science GPA and GRE scores will meet national averages.

GOAL 2: Develop, implement, and maintain a program whose focus is to graduate students with the knowledge, technical and professional skills for embarking on a physician assistant practice.

Outcome measures: Cohort persistence and graduation rate, PANCE first-time test scores

Benchmark: 1) Meet or exceed the national PA graduation rate in each cohort (92.6%*) as reported in the October 2019 PAEA "By the Numbers" publication; 2) Each cohort will meet or exceed the national pass rate on the PANCE.

GOAL 3: Provide PA students with inter-professional education and simulation experiences in preparation for clinical practice

Outcome measures: 1) Number of interprofessional simulations conducted in an academic year; and 2) PAS graduating student and preceptor perception of students' preparation for interprofessional collaboration, relating to colleagues and professionalism

Benchmark: 1) Meet or exceed target of at least 2 interprofessional simulations per year; and 2) on survey items score greater than or equal to 80% agreement on items and a mean of greater than or equal to 4.0/5.0 scale.
