
I am working in an alternative program in a middle school with children who come from hard places. I am working with these students to help them realize their own potential and to learn the social emotional skills they need to thrive.

I am unbiased and nonjudgemental. Everyone deserves services


The learning which took place in the classroom was always accompanied with unlearning and reassessing the ways in which we look at the world; those around us; the systems and institutions we navigate.
