

GENERAL ADMISSION PHILOSOPHY FOR UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT

Under the direction of the Assistant Vice President for Undergraduate Enrollment, offers of admission are made to undergraduate enrollment applicants. Members of Undergraduate Enrollment (UE) and Student Success and Engagement (SS&E) staffs will consider the applications of those candidates who fall into the defined criteria for Transitions Program acceptance as members of the Application Review Committee (ARC). The ARC is co-chaired by the Assistant Vice President for Undergraduate Enrollment and the Director of Transfer Admission, and includes representation from the SS&E division.

Dominican University employs a holistic admission review of a student's application materials that include cognitive and non-cognitive variables to determine a candidate's eligibility for admission. Admission decisions are made using a pre-determined set of criteria for all types of undergraduate applications, which are rooted in Dominican University's commitment to Caritas and Veritas. Ultimately, all exceptions to stated policies in this manual for undergraduate enrollment applicants must be approved by either the Assistant Vice President for Undergraduate Enrollment or the Vice President for Enrollment Management & Marketing.
